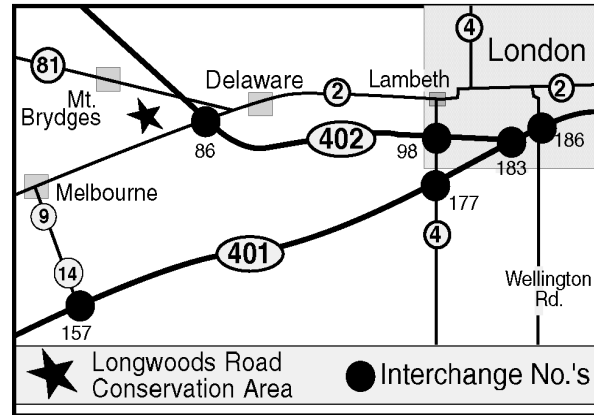

Driving Directions

Ska-Nah-Doht Village is located at 8348 Longwoods Road (Middlesex County Road 2) in Longwoods Road Conservation Area (6.5 km west of Delaware or 10 km east of Melbourne).

London and Toronto follow Hwy. 401 west, exit onto Hwy. 402 and take exit 86.

Chatham and Windsor, follow Hwy. 401 east and take exit 157.

Sarnia and Port Huron follow Hwy. 402 and take exit 86.

Watch for signs.

Located 20 minutes west of London, one hour east of Chatham, two hours west of Toronto, two hours east of Windsor and Detroit, one hour from Sarnia and Port Huron.

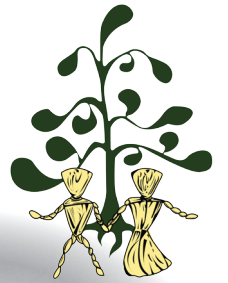

Workshops For All Ages!

Longwoods Road Conservation Area offers Conservation and Ska-Nah-Doht Village workshops to groups year round. Programs are 1 to 2 hours in length. Combine 2 or more for a full day of educational fun! There are also opportunities for groups to engage in community volunteer projects in a park setting at Longwoods. Special populations, church groups and seniors are encouraged to participate in workshops especially designed for them.

(For your school group please refer to our fliers for programs designed especially for schools.)

Workshop Fees

\$6 per person per workshop (*minimum fee is \$90 per workshop*). Workshops must be booked 3 weeks in advance. Please note some activities are restricted to certain months.

Family Reunions Outdoor Weddings Company Picnics

A large outdoor pavilion is suited for your group's special function. Equipped with wood barbecue, hydro, water and picnic tables, this open air shelter accommodates up to 150 people year round. Toss horseshoes, enjoy the baseball diamond or bring games for the large playing field. A fully serviced washroom is nearby (*May - October*).

Camping With Nature

For conservation-oriented groups, 3 camping areas are each able to accommodate up to 100 campers. All camping areas have picnic tables and firepits. Hydro, firewood and water are available. Serviced washrooms (*no showers*) are located nearby (*operational May - October*). Group camping may be combined with workshops to provide a complete weekend outing. Group camping is available year round.

Badge Workshops for Guides and Scouts
