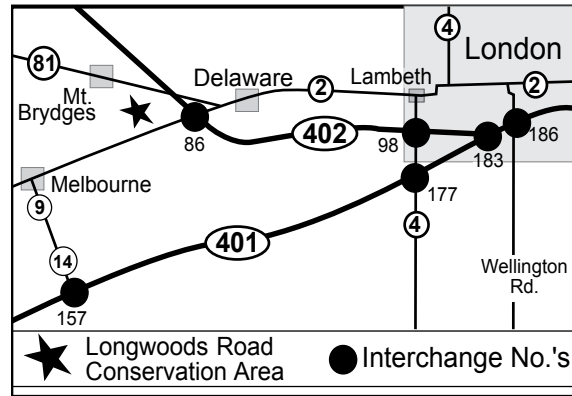

### Driving Directions:

Ska-Nah-Doht Village is located at 8348 Longwoods Road (Middlesex County Road 2) in Longwoods Road Conservation Area (6.5 km west of Delaware or 10 km east of Melbourne).

**Coordinates:** Lat/Long 42.874, -81.476  
UTM 461140, 4746990

**London and Toronto** follow Hwy. 401 west, exit onto Hwy. 402 and take exit 86.  
**Chatham and Windsor**, follow Hwy. 401 east and take exit 157.  
**Sarnia and Port Huron** follow Hwy. 402 and take exit 86.  
*Watch for road signs.*

Located 20 minutes west of London, one hour east of Chatham, two hours west of Toronto, two hours east of Windsor and Detroit, one hour from Sarnia and Port Huron.

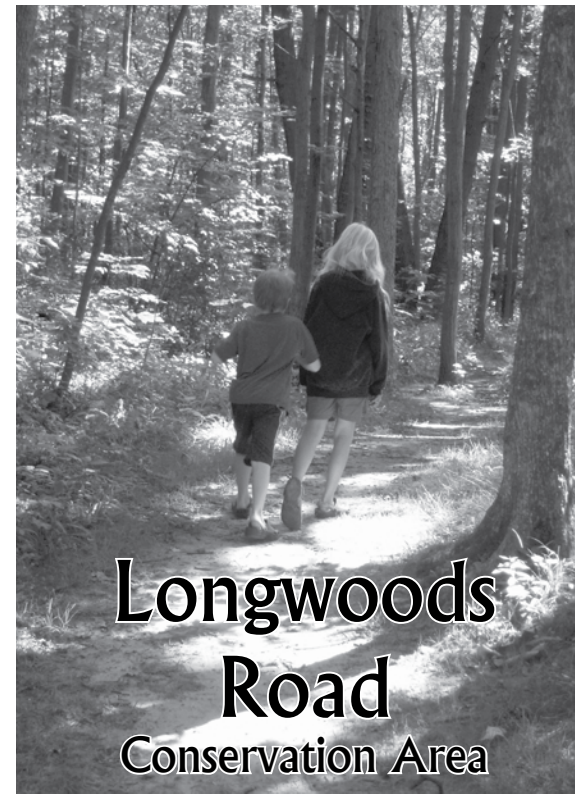

**Longwoods Road Conservation Area** is a place to enjoy the real outdoors! Accessible trails lead you on an adventure to a wetland boardwalk, across a meadow or even through a Carolinian forest and arboretum. Pack a picnic lunch and enjoy the whole day!

The **Resource Centre** is a great place to start! While there, discover the Ska-Nah-Doht museum collection, Native studies displays and a hands-on activity room. Environmental exhibits, puzzles, games and activities tell you all about conservation, and the bird viewing area is not to be missed! See a show, pick up a brochure and trail map. **Ska-Nah-Doht** is a recreated longhouse village of 1,000 years ago. The village is based on data collected by archaeologists and the Traditional Aboriginal Knowledge passed on by the First Nations people.

Ska-Nah-Doht is from the Oneida language which means **'a village stands again'**.

A walking tour includes finding your way through the palisade maze, exploring a longhouse and taking time to think about the life of the Haudenosaunee people.
