WATER HYACINTH **Invasive Species Alert!**

IMPACTS OF WATER HYACINTH

Water Hyacinth spreads rapidly, using up nutrients and forming dense mats that block sunlight. This displaces and threatens native vegetation. Other negative impacts include:

Blocks water flow

Dense mats can slow water flow and block waterways.

Reduces oxygen

Dense mats block light needed by plants 🚯 to grow. Reduced oxygen in the water harms fish and other aquatic species.

Promotes Disease Vectors

Water Hyacinth provides good breeding habitat for mosquitos and other possible disease carriers.

Impacts Recreation

Large mats can interfere with activities such as boating, swimming and fishing.

IDENTIFICATION

Green, thick, glossy, egg-shaped leaves

- Leaves float and form a rosette (circular arrangement)
- Flowers are on a spike that forms above the rosette of leaves
- Blue-violet petals with a yellow spot
- Fibrous, dark purple to black roots

NATIVE ALTERNATIVES



PICKERELWEED Pontederia cordata

Pickerelweed has a head of tiny blue-purple flowers and heart-shaped leaves that stand up out of the water. The flowers bloom from summer to early fall and can last for several months.

WHITE WATER LILY Nymphaea odorata

White Water Lilies have white-petaled flowers with a yellow center accompanied by floating, round, green leaves. The flowers bloom from summer to early fall, lasting 3 to 4 days.





BROADLEAF ARROWHEAD Sagittaria latifolia

Broadleaf Arrowhead has a flower stalk supporting multiple white flowers with yellow centers and arrow-shaped, green leaves that emerge out of the water. The flowers bloom from mid-summer to early fall, lasting 1 to 3 months.
