Banded Mysterysnails are thought to have spread from aquarium and live food market releases. Banded Mysterysnails are a concern because they:

rapidly reproduce and spread making it difficult to eradicate them;



harm native snails

by outcompeting them for habitat and food, thereby reducing their abundance;



spread disease and parasites to native snails and can kill aquatic birds or make them unable to fly;



threaten fish recruitment rates by preying on fish eggs, thereby reducing survival rates and



foul beaches following large die-offs.

Yellow to greenish brown with dark, red-brown, spiral bands.

- Spherical-shaped shell with whorls separated by deep sutures.
